1. CDL Driver Training Update

Effective July 8, 2015, the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (NJMVC) has revised the CDL knowledge and skills testing requirements. This is the direct result of the 2011 final rule that amended the commercial driver's license (CDL) knowledge and skills testing standards and established new minimum Federal standards for the states. This rulemaking is established from the Department of Transportation, Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) and affects all states. This also effects truck and motorcoach operations. The compliance date by the states for this rulemaking was July 8, 2015.

To date, we have the following limited information:

Pre-trip Inspection

- 1. Follow pre trip inspection section 11 in the CDL manual thoroughly. You should be able to identify each part (by touch and or pointing to) and tell the examiner what you are looking for or inspecting.
- 2. Specifics of pre-trip we have heard but not limited to: (refer to section 11 CDL manual)
 - Open hood on bus and identify components under the hold as listed in section 11 of the CDL manual
 - Check engine compartment belts for snugness
 - Prepare to check oil, coolant and power steering fluid levels
 - Tire pressure gauge must be used to check proper inflation, kicking or "thumping" the tires is not acceptable
 - Check seats by touching bolts at floor level and on rails as well as seat backs and bottoms.
- 3. For class B and C pre trip inspection tests, you will be required to perform one of three versions

of a pre-trip inspection in the vehicle you brought for the test. Each of the three tests are equivalent and you will not know which test you will take until just before the test begins. Study all parts of section 11 in the CDL manual that apply.

- 4. You will need to inspect any special features of your vehicle (e.g. school bus).
- 5. "Banking" of any part of the test is no longer permitted. If you fail a portion of the test, you need to take the entire test over.

Basic Skills

1. Basic control skills will be tested off road using one or more of the following exercises from each category:

Category 1: straight line backing

Category 2: offset back to the right and or offset back to the left

Category 3: sight side (driver) parallel park and or parallel park (conventional method), and or 90 degree alley dock.

- 2. Reference section 12.2 and figures of CDL manual.
- 3. See scoring section 12.1 of CDL manual.

Road Test

1. Refer to section 13 of CDL manual.

If your driver fails the test at any point in the test, the driver will receive a CDL Test Results Fail/Denial Form from NJMVC. This form is informational and marks items that require attention. See the attached form.

Please keep in mind that this alert is as of July 23, 2015 and may be updated as new information is obtained.

2. <u>Legislation (A1029) - Driver Training Special Needs</u>

A1029 - Requires training program for school bus drivers and school bus aides on interacting with students with special needs, and requires development and use of student information cards. Requires Commissioner of Education to develop training program for drivers and aides on transporting students with special needs. Program development within 180 days of law enactment. Then districts and contractors must train and certify to Department of Education by a specified time frame.



DATED: JUNE 11, 2015

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1029 (2R).

This bill requires that the Commissioner of Education develop a training program for school bus drivers and school bus aides on interacting with students with special needs. The training program would include appropriate behavior management, effective communication, the use and operation of adaptive equipment, and understanding behavior that may be related to specific disabilities. Once the training program is made available, boards of education and school bus contractors that provide student transportation services under contract with boards of education would be required to administer the training program to all school bus drivers and school bus aides that they employ. The employer would also require a school bus driver or school bus aide to certify that the individual has completed the training program within five business days of its completion. The employer must retain a copy of the certification for the duration of that individual's employment and forward a copy of the certification to the Department of Education.

The bill also requires that the Commissioner of Education develop a student information card that contains information that should be readily available to school bus drivers and school bus aides for the purpose of promoting proper interaction with a student with special needs. The student information card would be completed by the parent or guardian of a student with an individualized education plan when the individualized education plan is developed or amended. Upon receiving consent from a student's parent or guardian, the school district would provide the completed student information card to the school bus driver and school bus aide assigned to the student's bus route.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 274, which was amended and reported by the committee on this same date.

1 AN ACT concerning training of school bus drivers and aides and 2 supplementing chapter 39 of Title 18A of the New Jersey 3 Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. The Commissioner of Education shall develop a training program for school bus drivers and school bus aides on proper procedures for interacting with students with special needs. The training program shall include, but need not be limited to, the following:
 - a. appropriate behavior management;
 - b. effective communication;
 - c. use and operation of adaptive equipment; and
- d. understanding behaviors that may be related to specific disabilities.

The commissioner shall make the training program available to boards of education and school bus contractors providing pupil transportation services under contract with boards of education no later than one year following the effective date of this act.

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- 2. a. An employer shall administer the training program developed pursuant to section 1 of this act to all school bus drivers and school bus aides that it employs. In the case of an individual who is employed prior to the development and availability of the training program, the employer shall administer the training program to the individual no later than 180 days after the training program is made available by the commissioner. In the case of an individual who is employed after the development and availability of the training program, the employer shall administer the training program to the individual prior to that individual operating a school bus or serving as an aide on a school bus.
- b. ¹An employer shall require that a school bus driver or school bus aide file a certification with the employer that the individual has completed the training program within five business days of its completion. The employer shall retain a copy of the certification for the duration of the individual's employment ², and shall forward a copy of the certification to the Department of Education².
- 40 <u>c.</u> As used in this section, "employer" means a board of 41 education or a contractor that provides pupil transportation services 42 under contract with a board of education.



SYNOPSIS

Allows board of education to award pupil transportation contracts that exceed bid threshold through request for proposals.

AN ACT concerning pupil transportation contracts, amending N.J.S.18A:39-3 and P.L.2001, c.65, and supplementing chapter 39 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

29.

- 1. N.J.S.18A:39-3 is amended to read as follows:
- 18A:39-3. a. [No] Except as otherwise provided pursuant to section 3 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), no contract for the transportation of pupils to and from school shall be made, when the amount to be paid during the school year for such transportation shall exceed \$7,500.00 or the amount determined pursuant to subsection b. of this section, and have the approval of the executive county superintendent of schools, unless the board of education making such contract shall have first publicly advertised for bids therefor in a newspaper published in the district or, if no newspaper is published therein, in a newspaper circulating in the district, once, at least 10 days prior to the date fixed for receiving proposals for such transportation, and shall have awarded the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

Nothing in this chapter shall require the advertisement and letting on proposals or bids of annual extensions, approved by the executive county superintendent, of any contract for transportation entered into through competitive bidding when--

- (1) Such annual extensions impose no additional cost upon the board of education, regardless of the fact that the route description has changed; or
- (2) The increase in the contractual amount as a result of such extensions does not exceed the rise in the Consumer Price Index as defined in section 3 of P.L.2007, c.260 (C.18A:7F-45) for that school year, regardless of the fact that the route description has changed or an aide has been added or removed; or
 - (3) (Deleted by amendment, P.L.1982, c.74.)
- (4) The increase in the contractual amount as a result of an extension exceeds the rise in the Consumer Price Index as defined in section 3 of P.L.2007, c.260 (C.18A:7F-45) for that school year, but the following apply to the extensions:
- (a) The increase is directly attributable to a route change to accommodate new student riders or safety concerns as provided for in the original bid, or the increase is directly attributable to the addition of an aide as provided for in the original bid; and
- (b) The school destination remains unchanged from the original contract.

EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Any such extension as described in this paragraph shall require the approval of the executive county superintendent of schools.

Nothing in this chapter shall require the immediate bid of any contract renewal for the remainder of a school year in which the only change, in addition to route description, is the bus type. However, any such extension shall be approved by the executive county superintendent of schools and shall be bid for the next school year.

b. The Governor, in consultation with the Department of the Treasury, shall, no later than March 1 of each odd-numbered year, adjust the threshold amount set forth in subsection a. of this section, or subsequent to 1985 the threshold amount resulting from any adjustment under this subsection or section 17 of P.L.1985, c.469, in direct proportion to the rise or fall of the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers in the New York City and the Philadelphia areas as reported by the United States Department of Labor. The Governor shall, no later than June 1 of each odd-numbered year, notify all local school districts of the adjustment. The adjustment shall become effective on July 1 of each odd-numbered year.

- 2. Section 3 of P.L.2001, c.65 (C.18A:39-3.1) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. A board of education shall consult with the appropriate nonpublic school administrators seeking such consultation prior to preparing bus routes for the transportation of nonpublic school pupils for the school year and in a timely manner that allows sufficient time to publicly advertise for bids or issue a request for proposals.

- 3. (New section) a. Notwithstanding the provisions of N.J.S.18A:39-3 or any other section of law to the contrary, a board of education may award a contract for the transportation of pupils to and from school, that exceeds the amount determined pursuant to subsection b. of N.J.S.18A:39-3 and has the approval of the executive county superintendent of schools, through an evaluation of proposals submitted in response to a request for proposals issued by the board.
- b. When a board of education elects to award a pupil transportation contract in response to a request for proposals, the board shall evaluate each proposal from a responding contractor according to criteria established by the Commissioner of Education that shall include at a minimum:
- (1) the previous experience of the contractor in transporting pupils;
- (2) the name of each transportation company of which the contractor has been an owner or manager;

1	(3) a description of any safety programs implemented by the
2	contractor;
3	(4) a record of accidents of the school buses under the control of
4	the contractor;
5	(5) the driving history of the employees of the contractor;
6	(6) the inspection records and model year of the school buses

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16	STATEMENT
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18	Under current law at N.J.S.18A:39-3, if the amount of a contract
19	for pupil transportation services will exceed the public bidding
20	threshold, the board of education is required to advertise and
21	publicly bid the contract. This bill provides the board of education
22	with the option of entering into such a contract through a request for
23	proposals process.
24	Under the bill's provisions, when a board of education elects to
25	award a pupil transportation contract in response to a request for
26	proposals, the board will evaluate each proposal from a responding
27	contractor in accordance with criteria established by the
28	Commissioner of Education. The bill stipulates that the criteria
29	must include at a minimum:
30	(1) the previous experience of the contractor in transporting
31	pupils;
32	(2) the name of each transportation company of which the
33	contractor has been an owner or manager;
34	(3) a description of any safety programs implemented by the
